

ART HISTORY B.A. MAJOR CHECK

The Bachelor of Arts (BA) program in the history and criticism of art requires a total of **forty-five semester hours**, of which thirty-nine will be in art history and six in studio art. The foundation courses (ARH 2050, ARH 2051) provide a broad view of major artists and monuments from Western Art History and are to be taken as early as possible. Majors are required to take two World Art (Non-Western) courses, six upper-level Art History courses (ARH 3/4xxx), and two seminars in Art History (ARH 4800). Art History majors satisfy the University Computer Competency/Digital Literacy requirement with ARH 2814. **Only a grade of "C" or better is acceptable for courses in Art History to be credited toward the major.** Students must also satisfy the university language requirement for the BA degree. **NOTE: There is no "double-counting" in the major; each separate line, excluding the language requirement, counts as three semester (credit) hours that add up to a forty-five-(45)-semester-hour major.**
